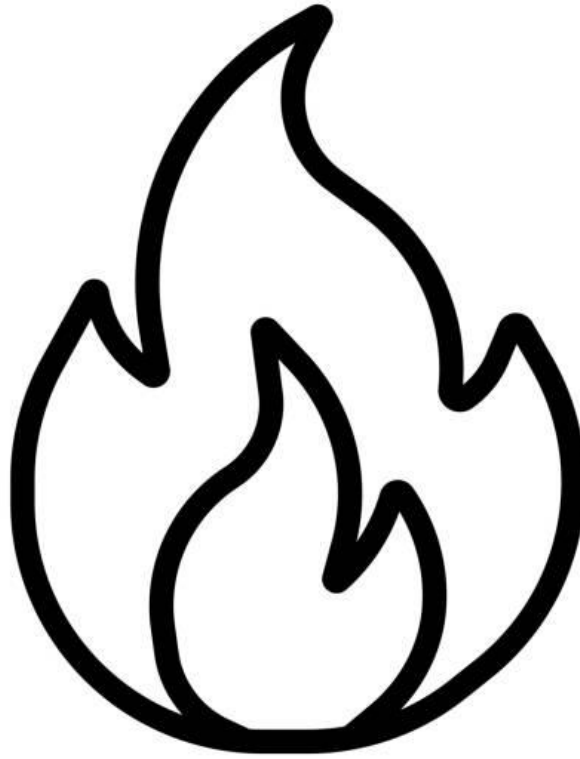

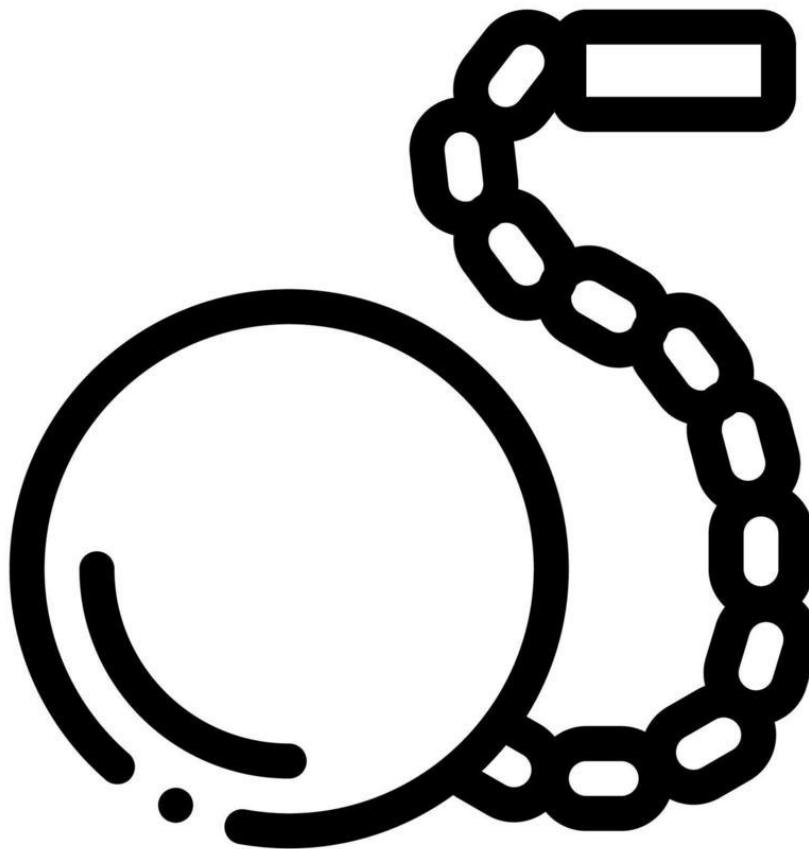
Salvation—from the *penalty* of sin.

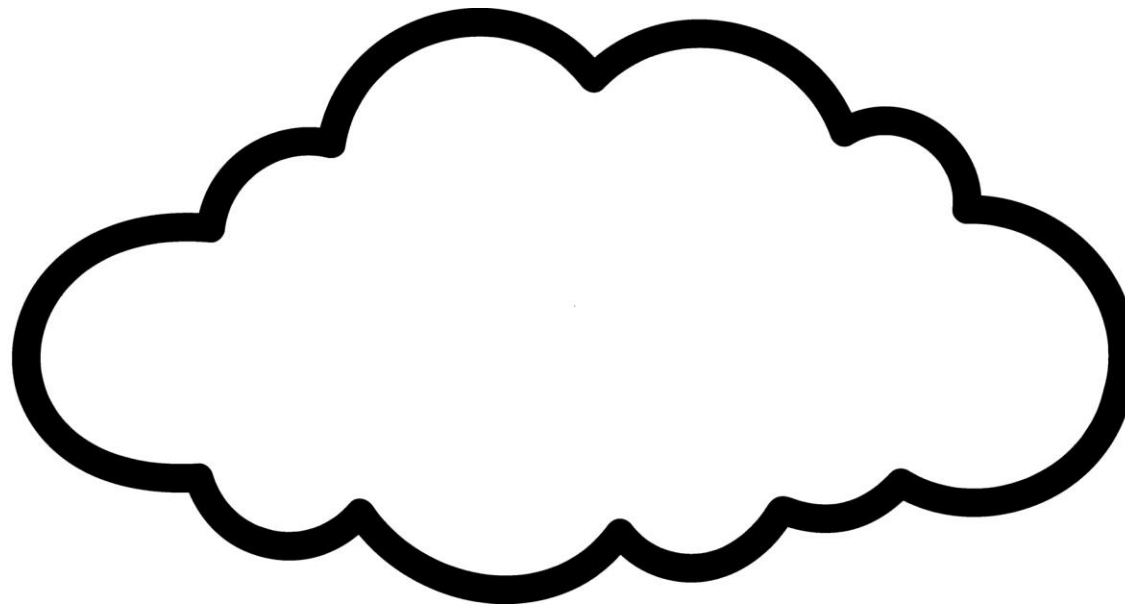
Salvation—from the *power* of sin.

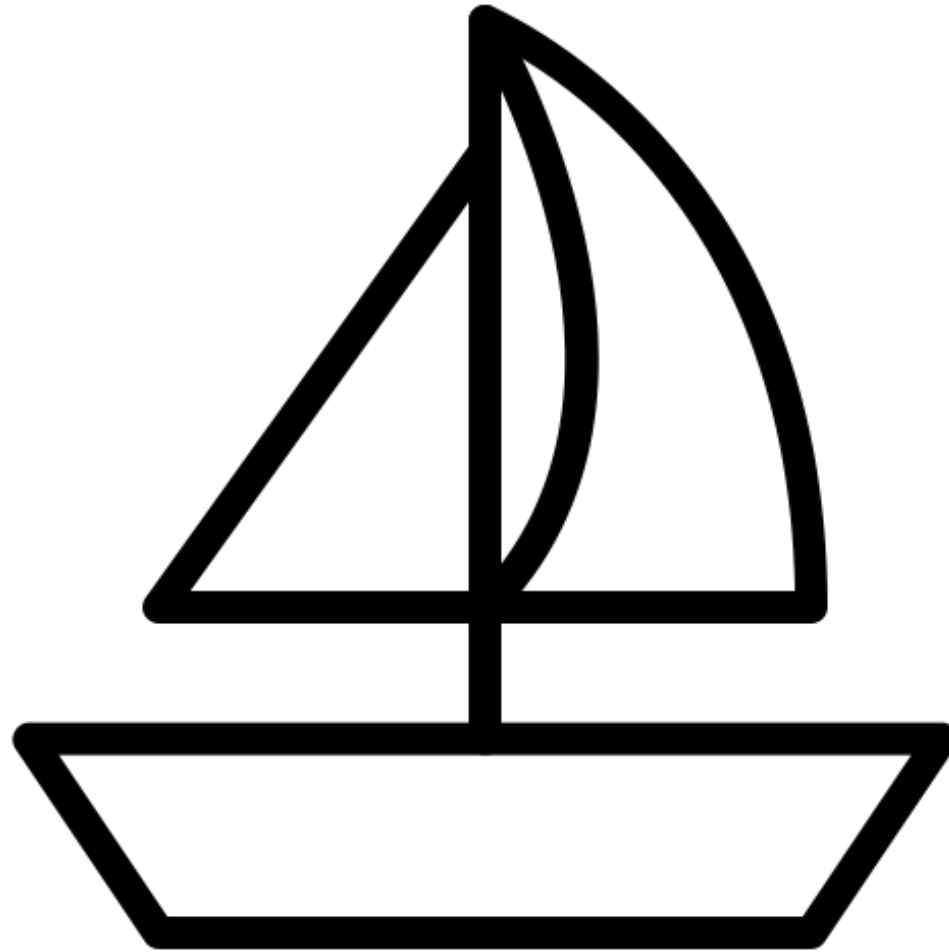
Salvation—from the *presence* of sin.

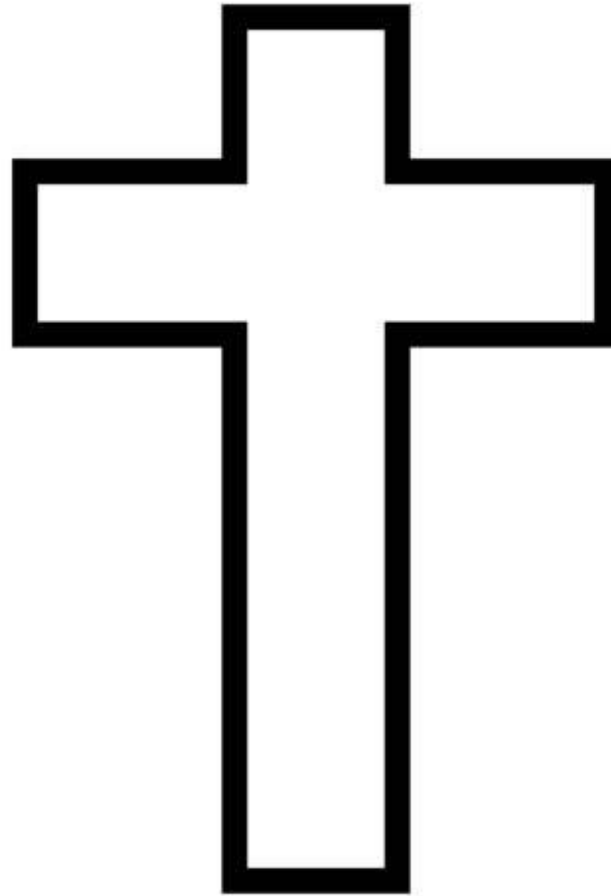
